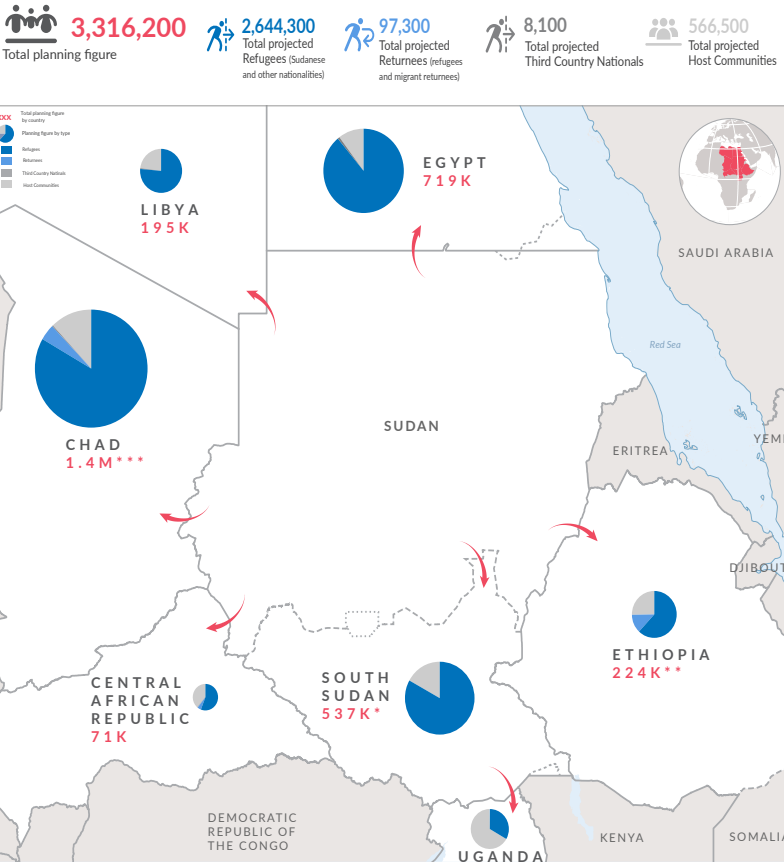

OVERVIEW

As we enter the second year of conflict in Sudan, some 10 million people have been forcibly displaced. Just over two million people have arrived in neighbouring countries including refugees, returnees, and third country nationals, with 7.7 million newly internally displaced within Sudan and 220,000 refugees who self-relocated within Sudan. These numbers continue to increase at an alarming rate as the fighting and displacement continue, particularly with recent escalations in Al Fasher in Sudan, with some 143,000 people forcibly displaced. As the impact of the conflict continues to spread, two new countries Libya and Uganda, are now part of the regional refugee response plan.

The Mid-Year Update of the 2024 Sudan Regional Refugee Response Plan (RRP) outlines the multi-agency, multi-sector response strategy and financial requirements of 86 partners supporting host governments in the Central African Republic, Chad, Egypt, Ethiopia, Libya, South Sudan and Uganda, to respond with life-saving and in tandem, resilience building interventions for a projected 3.3 million people (up from 2.7 million), including refugees, returnees (both refugees and migrants), third country nationals and host communities. The projected number of refugees to be assisted by the RRP in Egypt has increased to 640,000, as the number of registrations surged beyond what was anticipated earlier. As humanitarian needs continue to grow exponentially and with Libya and Uganda now part of the regional response, the financial requirements through the end of the year are USD 1.5 billion (up from 1.4 billion). Funding for the regional response plan is low –as of June, the plan was only 19 per cent funded. The ask for USD 1.5 billion covers crucial protection functions such as registration and identification of the most vulnerable, response structures for gender-based violence, mental health, food, transport, logistics, health, and education among others.



The implementation of the Sudan RRP is in accordance with the Global Compact on Refugees and the Refugee Coordination Model, in close collaboration with RRP partners, to support host governments who have taken the lead in responding to this crisis. UNHCR's Regional Director for the East, Horn of Africa and the Great Lakes, Mr. Mamadou Dian Balde, is the Regional Refugee Coordinator for the Sudan emergency. Existing coordination mechanisms ensure that partners work effectively, share information and avoid duplication of efforts. There is a strong push to engage development actors in supporting host communities and areas of return from the outset. UNHCR leads the response for refugees; IOM leads the response for migrants.

1. UN agencies and some international NGOs are operational in more than one country but are counted only once as a partner in the RRP although their interventions may vary by country.

2. This figure includes Sudanese refugees and others who were themselves refugees in Sudan now fleeing into neighbouring countries.

3. The returnee figure includes refugees and migrants who were hosted in Sudan and are now returning to their countries of origin. There are an additional 820,000 returnees (refugees and migrants) who are included in the HRP for South Sudan and are not included in the planning figure for the Sudan Regional RRP.

4. There are 18,000 Ethiopian migrant returnees and 5,000 third country nationals in Ethiopia who are also not included in this RRP; they are reflected in the IOM Response Overview for the Sudan Crisis and Neighboring Countries.

5. 110,000 migrant returnees from 2023 in Chad are included in the HRP for Chad.
